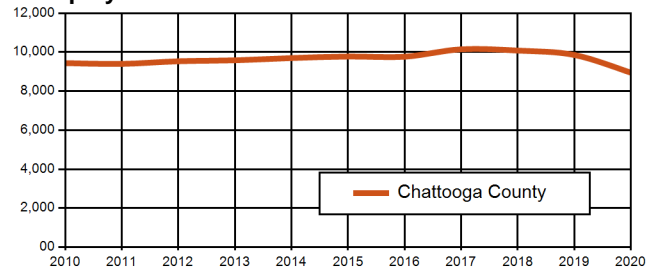

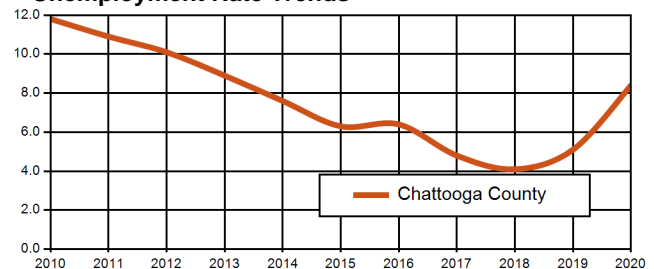

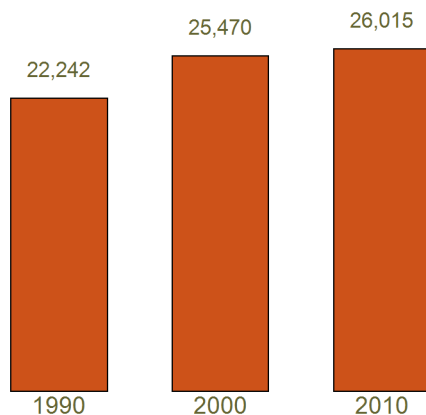

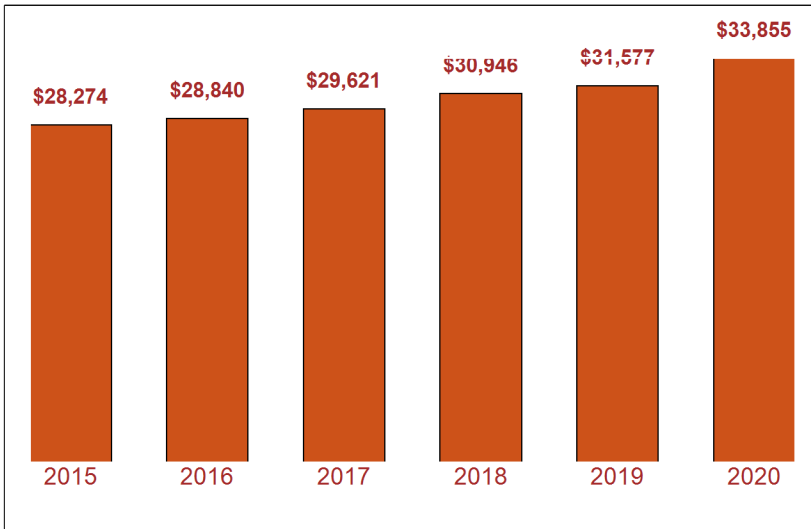

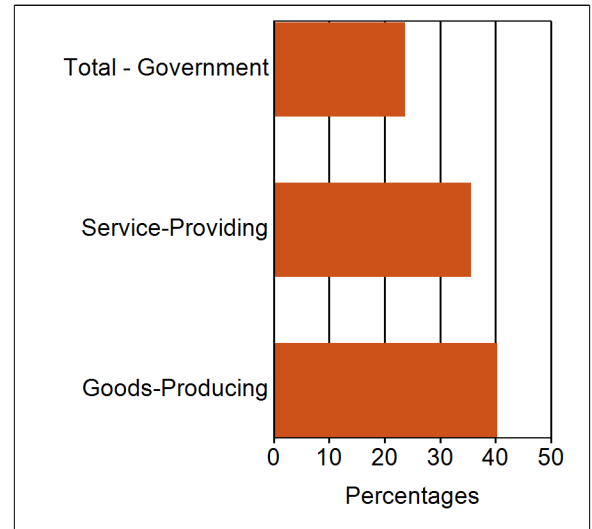
Chattooga Per Capita Income
