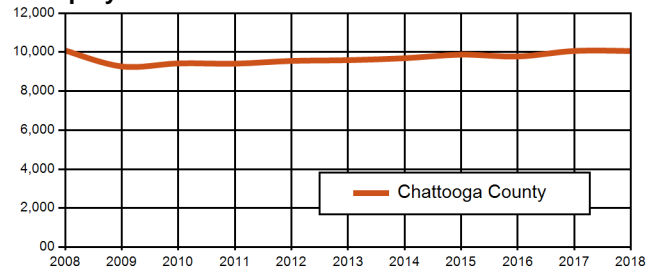

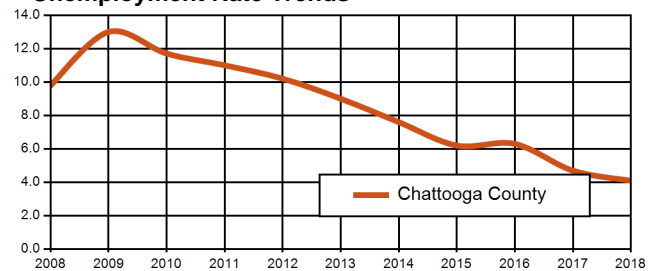

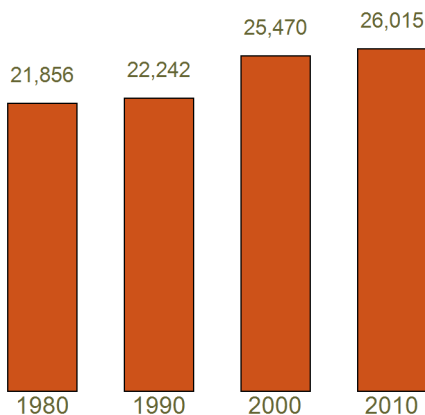
Employment Trends

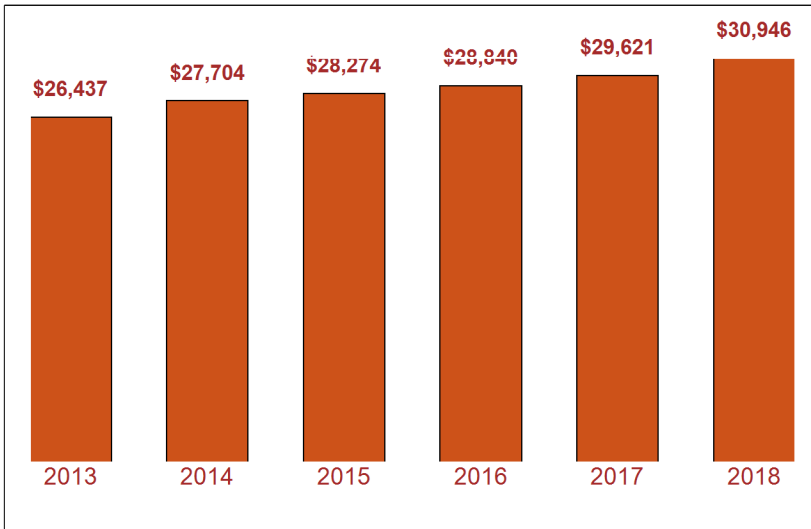

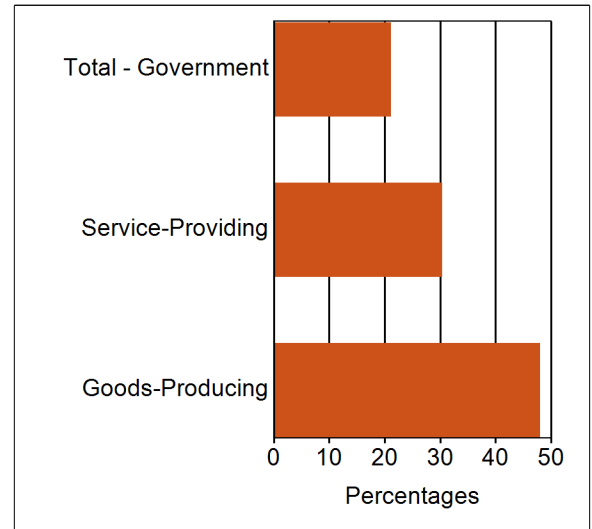
Chattooga Per Capita Income
