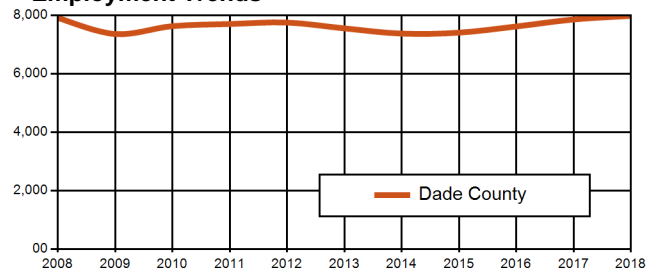

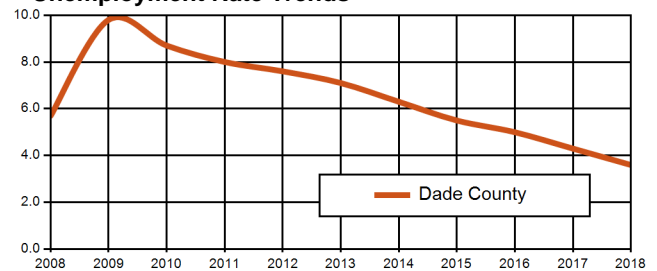

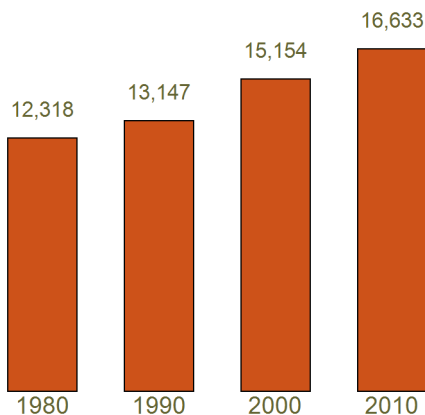

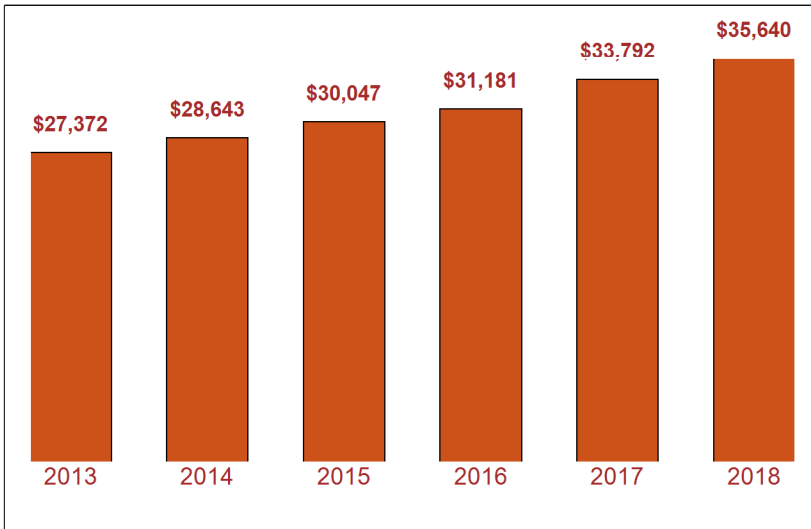

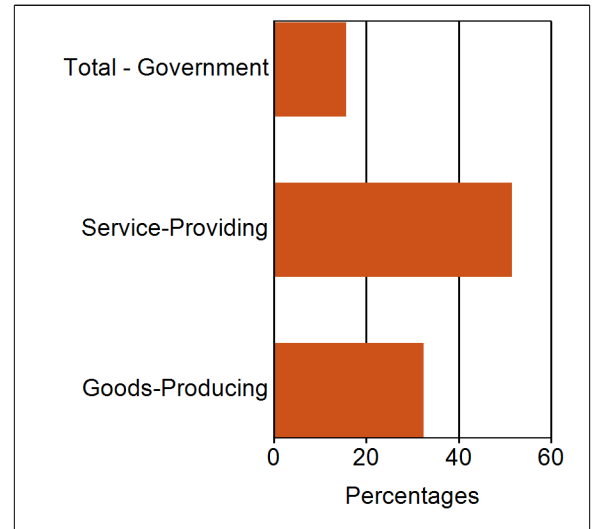
Dade Per Capita Income
